

OFSAA Age Classification for the 2018-2019 School Year

OFSAA By-Law 5, Eligibility for Competition, Section 4 – Individuals, subsection (iii) states: “meet the following age requirements”

SENIOR - the individual's birth certificate indicates that he/she has not reached his/her **19th birthday** prior to **January 1st** prior to the start of the school year in which the competition is held.

JUNIOR - the individual's birth certificate indicates that he/she has not reached his/her **15th birthday** by **January 1st** prior to the start of the school year in which the competition is held.

MIDGET - the individual's birth certificate indicates that he/she has not reached his/her **14th birthday** by **January 1st** prior to the start of the school year in which the competition is held. Students may compete in this category for one year only in Grade 9:

1998 or earlier	– ineligible
1999 -	senior
2000 -	senior
2001 -	senior
2002 -	senior
2003/2004 -	junior
2004 -	midget – students may compete in this category for one year only

HOW OLD WAS THE STUDENT ON JANUARY 1, 2018 ?

Years of Eligibility

Coaches and students are reminded that students are eligible for no more than five consecutive years from date of entry into Grade 9. There is no appeal to this rule.
